Apr. 13 - City Steps

Pittsburgh has the largest number of public stairways in the country, 900-- more than Los Angeles, San Francisco, and Seattle. Built during the city's population heyday as a cost-effective measure to move 700,000 people from their homes on the hills to the mills lining the three rivers, city steps offered a free and efficient way to get around.
