Apr. 24th - History Making Women in W. PA Sports (CC)

There is no shortage of history-making women with Western PA connections, but their stories have often been overlooked in the history books and overshadowed by the achievements of Pittsburgh's well-known men of industry. Anne Madarasz from the Heinz History Center will be with us to talk about some of their stories.

May 1st - "Growing Up Yinzer" Author Dick Roberts (CC)

"How do you tell Pittsburgh's story?". In book form, with the help of famous yinzers. Fifty-one beloved Pittsburghers share memories and reflections about how growing up in the city shaped them.

May 8th - PA Trolley Museum (CC)

Take a ride into the past with PA Trolley Museum Volunteer George Gula who will talk about the trolleys in the South Hills along with information about the museum.

May 15th - "On the Rocks: The Primadonna Story" Authors Maria Palmer and Ruthie Robbins (CC)

A new book tells the saucy inside story of the beloved McKees Rocks restaurant The Primadonna. The author (who is the owner's daughter) will be here to talk about the rise and fall of one of Pittsburgh's favorite restaurants. Books will be available to purchase for \$21.35 for paperback and \$30.95 for hardback.

May 22nd - Local Poet Who Writes for Fun! (CC)

Joyce Leep Petrichek has been writing poems for most of her life, for young and old and one of her greatest pleasures is sharing them with others. Her poems are funny and heartwarming. She most enjoys interacting with listeners, who, often, without realizing it, plant ideas for new poems in her heart.

May 29th - Unsolved Murder in Snowden Village (CC)

Talk about a very local true crime story! On May 16, 1928, Lehr's grandmother was murdered in what was then the Snowden Village. The cold case murder of a coal miner's wife has never been solved. Karen's extensive research includes photographs, the coroner's report and statements from neighbors. She will present some possible scenarios of how she thinks the crime was committed.

Jun. 5th - "The Whiskey Rebellion: A Distilled History History of an American Crisis" Author Brady J. Crytzer (CC)

It was a bloody bottleneck of opposing American values soon after the Revolutionary War. It was about taxes and government influence, issues that still haven't been entirely resolved. And some of it happened in our backyard.
